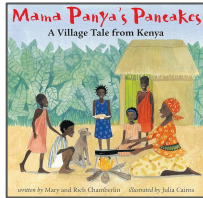
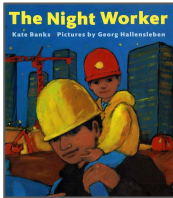
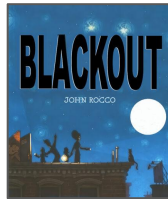
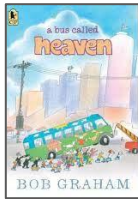
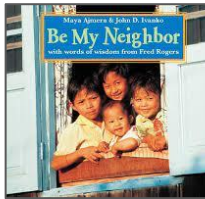
### Interactive Read-Alouds

**Essential Question:** What makes a community?

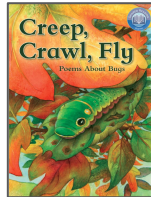
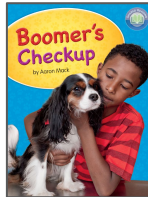
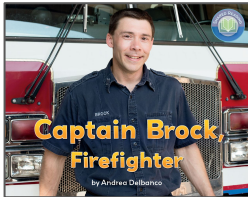

We will read and reread the following texts **together**:

### Word Work

We will complete our suffix -s unit. Then we will turn our attention to glued or welded sounds that end in -ng (-ang, -ing, -ong & -ung). For example, *fang*, *ring*, *song*, and *lung*. A glued sound is one in which the letters keep their individual sounds but are hard to separate.

### Readers' Workshop

We will get to know characters inside and out, infer their motivations, and make predictions about their future actions based on our knowledge of their prior behaviors and choices.

**Our reading principles are:**

- The words and the pictures show what a character looks like on the outside
- The words and pictures show what a character is like on the inside
- Think about why a character says or does something
- Use what you know about a character to predict what the character will do next
- Think about whether you would like to be friends with a character

### Writers' Workshop

We will concentrate on English writing conventions, specifically capitalization.

**Our writing principles are:**

- Capitalize the first letter of a name
- Capitalize the first letter of the first word in a sentence
- Capitalize the important words in the title
