Interactive Read-Alouds


We will listen to and discuss the following books:


Text Set: Genre Study: Exploring Fiction and Nonfiction















Shared Reading

Word Work

Our next unit focuses on words that include the glued or welded sounds -am e.g. jam, ram, yam, slam, scram and -an e.g. can, pan, man, fan, ran, van, than, plan, scan etc.

Readers' Workshop

Our reading minilessons will explore the differences between fiction and nonfiction.

Our reading principles are:

- Fiction books are stories that are made up in the author's imagination
- Nonfiction books are about real people, real places, and real things
- Fiction books tell stories that have characters, a problem, and a solution
- Nonfiction books tell true facts and information about a topic

Writers' Workshop

We will write stories with an attention to the key elements of fiction including setting, character, problem, and solution. Our writing principles are:

- Describe where the story takes place
- Draw where the story takes place
- Describe the characters or people in the story
- Use shapes to draw people

Mathematics

Topic 5: Work with Addition and Subtraction Equations We will discover that the equal sign means both sides of an equation have **the same value**. We will decide whether equations are true or false and find the missing number in equations. We will also learn about the Associative Property of Addition—specifically that three numbers can be grouped and added in different ways, and the sum will always stay the same.

Topic 2: The Sky

Science Experience: Observe the Sun, Moon, and Stars

We will continue to observe how the amount of daylight changes throughout the year and compare the daylight in different seasons. We will learn that these changes happen because Earth is tilted, causing different parts of the planet to receive more or less sunlight at different times of the year.
