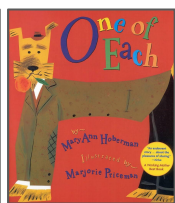
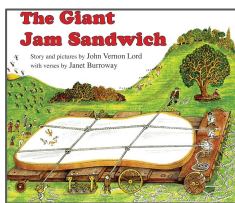
Interactive Read-Alouds

Essential Question: What makes these stories fun to read together?

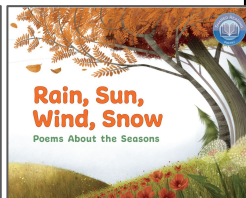
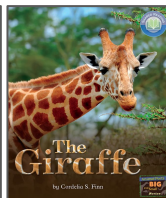
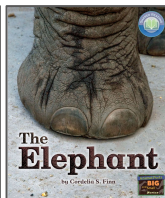

Readers' Workshop

- Read the sentence again and get your mouth ready for the first sound.
- Read the sentence again and think about what would make sense, sound right, and look right.

Writing About Reading

- Collect your thinking in your Reader's Notebook
- Draw and write about yourself and the things you love

Mathematics



Topic: Understand Addition and Subtraction

We will focus on change unknown or missing addend word problems. E.g. Jack has 2 pencils. He gets some more pencils from a box. Now he has 9 pencils. How many pencils did he get from the box?

We will discover that we can use both addition and subtraction equations to show situations with a missing part or addend.

E.g. $2 + \underline{\quad} = 9$ known part + missing part = whole/total
 $9 - 2 = \underline{\quad}$ whole/total - known part = missing part
