Mathematics

Topic: Understand Addition and Subtraction

We will focus on change unknown or missing addend word problems. E.g. Jack has 2 pencils. He gets some more pencils from a box. Now he has 9 pencils. How many pencils did he get from the box?

We will discover that we can use both addition and subtraction equations to show situations with a missing part or addend.

E.g. 2 + 2 = 9 known part + missing part = whole/total 9 - 2 = 2 whole/total - known part = missing part
